For the politician, the information you are to include in your virtual museum must answer the following questions:

- (1) When and where was the world leader born? When and where did he die?
- (2) What level of education did the leader have? College educated? If so, what college, university, or military institution?
- (3) What did he do prior to assuming power? For example, was he a career soldier, businessman, lawyer, doctor, priest, etc.?
- (4) When and how did he come to power? When and how did he leave power?
- (5) What country or religion did he rule?
- (6) What was his greatest accomplishment?
- (7) What did he do after World War II?
- (8) Describe his family. For example, was he married with children?

For your general / admiral, the information you are to include in your virtual museum must answer the following questions:

- (1) When and where was the general or admiral born? When and where did he die?
- (2) Is the general /admiral college educated? If so, which college, university or military academy?
- (3) What country did he serve?
- (4) Did he serve in any other war? Which ones?
- (5) During World War II, where did he serve?
- (6) What did he do after World War II? For example, did he continue to serve in the military or enter politics? Be specific.
- (7) Describe his family. For example, was he married with children?
- (8) Who was the highest ranking women in the United States military?*
